## Equine MRI

We've had a very busy month here for scans in our Standing Equine MRI both of our own and with referral cases. Early, safe and accurate diagnosis is paramount when your horse goes lame and with over 250 scans performed here now, it has become a major tool in delivering gold standard lameness investigations and diagnoses. The unit is fully temperature controlled set at $20^{\circ}$ to keep patients cool and comfortable as the weather heats up. ## Summer Worm Egg Counts

Has your horse had a worm egg count yet? We recommend using Faecal Worm Egg Counts (FWEC) during the Spring - Autumn months to assess which horses require worming.


Effective worm control relies on the correct and responsible use of wormers combined with good pasture management. These tests are carried out in house in our Laboratory and are available as individual tests or we offer group discounts for large yards.
