# GASTROSCOPY OFFER



## UP TO 50% OFF GASTROSCOPY IN FEBRUARY 2017

It's estimated that up to 100% of racehorses and 63% of performance horses could suffer from gastric ulcers, but many don't show any clinical signs. The only certain way to check is to examine the horse's stomach by performing a gastroscopy.

### What causes ulcers?

Travelling<sup>3</sup>, competing and training<sup>4,5</sup> can all increase the risk of gastric ulcers developing.

### How can you tell if your horse is at risk?

Signs are difficult to spot but they can include poor appetite, impaired performance, poor body condition, change in temperament and colic.

### Can they be treated?

If a horse is found to be suffering from gastric ulcers, an effective oral treatment is available. You will also receive advice about management changes and you may be given an anti-ulcer gastric supplement.

### What to do if you suspect your horse could have a gastric ulcer.

The only definitive way to diagnose gastric ulcers is with gastroscopy. During February we are taking part in the 2017 Fit to Go: Innervision Gastric Health Month. All horses undergoing gastroscopy in February will get up to **1/3 off** the normal price of the procedure. In addition, on Friday 24<sup>th</sup>, Monday 27<sup>th</sup> and Tuesday 28<sup>th</sup> February we will be holding three special gastroscopy days at our main practice and the procedure will be **half price** on those days.
