## **New Regulations**

The Royal College of Veterinary Surgeons (RCVS) who is the regulatory body for all veterinary surgeons in the UK has introduced new regulations on 1st September 2023 that affect how Veterinary Surgeons can prescribe 'prescription only medications (POM-Vs)' such as antibiotics and controlled medications.



The key changes that will affect you as horse owners are:

Any type of antibiotics, controlled drug or POM-V can only be prescribed after your horse has had a physical examination by a vet. This applies to all antibiotics, including oral, injectable, and topical (creams and ointments). Antibiotics cannot be given based on photographs only - a physical examination of the animal is required legally.
